AEP will present a panel discussion of the topic: *Cultural Resources for CEQA Writers*. Come hear what CEQA professionals should know about the Section 106 process, tribal consultation, cultural resource surveys, and information sources that that could help complete projects more efficiently.

The following resource experts will be presenting:

- *Ellen Bowden, North Central information Center (NCIC)* –Ms. Bowden, M.A., has 17 years experience in California archaeology. Her work has involved cultural resources displays, collections inventory, and cultural resources surveys in northern California. At NCIC she performs records searches for archaeologists, planners, environmental firms, as well as local, state, and federal agencies.
- *Tom Gates, North State Resources* – Dr. Gates is an anthropologist/archaeologist responsible for managing North State Resources, Inc.'s, Cultural Resources Program. He has more than 15 years of experience and meets the Secretary of Interior Standards and Guidelines as a qualified principal investigator. Dr. Gates possesses a thorough understanding of the Section 106 process and is experienced with Native American tribal consultations and outreach. He has performed numerous cultural resources investigations to comply with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA), and other pertinent regulations.
- *Michelle Treviño, WAVE Consulting* – Ms. Treviño, M.A., is a cultural resources specialist with professional experience encompassing a wide range of activities in the field, laboratory, and office, dealing with pre-Contact, protohistoric, and historic resources, as well as the built environment. Her experience includes surveys, excavation, and historic archival research.

This panel will consider information centers, tribes, and field surveys and how they relate to the CEQA process. After their presentation, they will be happy to take questions on Section 106 consultation.
